**RECYCLE THESE ITEMS ONLY!**



Newspaper, printing paper and  
magazines (no shredded paper, no gift  
wrap or tissue paper).



Cardboard boxes (example: cereal/prepared food &  
detergent boxes)



Aluminum beverage cans



Steel tin cans (includes vegetable/fruit/soup types)



Plastic bottles, jugs & containers (includes milk/juice/  
water/soft drink/condiment/shampoo/detergent/soap  
type jugs & bottles showing the "1" thru "7" recycle  
symbol on bottom. No plastic bags, wrap or sheeting).



Glass food and beverage jars and bottles  
(clear/green/brown)



**PLEASE.....PLEASE.....PLEASE.....**



**NO PLASTIC BAGS IN THE BLUE BOX!**

Plastic bags are not accepted in the City's recycling  
programs. DO NOT BAG RECYCLABLES!  
LEAVE 'EM LOOSE!!!!



**REUSE PLASTIC BAGS:**

Take them with you shopping to re-use your bags  
instead of recycling or throwing them out!

**RECYCLE PLASTIC BAGS:**

Stores in Kenora offering plastic bag recycling  
include: Canada Safeway and Walmart. Bag  
recycling bins are usually found near the entrance.  
Stores accepting plastic bags are subject to change.

**NO SHREDDED PAPER IN THE BLUE BOX!**

Shredded paper, when mixed with other  
recyclables, becomes a contaminant. Shredding  
degrades paper quality and makes it difficult to  
market. Please bag-n-tie shredded paper and place it  
with your trash.

**NO STYROFOAM IN THE BLUE BOX!**

Styrofoam materials are NOT accepted. No  
Styrofoam packing materials, P-nuts, fast-food  
containers or egg cartons.

# WHAT IS RECYCLABLE?

## Household Paper



All paper products, including NEWS-PAPERS, INSERTS, JUNK MAIL, PHONE BOOKS, CATALOGUES, MAGAZINES, FINE PAPER\* and PAPERBACK BOOKS, can be recycled together.

**NO** Do not put your paper products in plastic grocery bags. Place all paper inside your blue box loose.

**NO** No paper towels, paper cups, construction paper, photographs, postcards or hardcover books.

(\*FINE PAPER includes COMPUTER PAPER, PHOTOCOPY PAPER, WRITING PAPER, WHITE ENVELOPES (with or without windows), and other HIGH-QUALITY PAPERS. Normal household quantities can be mixed with the papers listed above. If you have larger quantities from a home business or a move, keep fine paper separate, put it in clear plastic bags and tie for collection.)

## Metal Cans & Tins



Includes all :

**FOOD & BEVERAGE CANS**

**YES** **CANS** : Rinse well. Place sharp lids inside cans and pinch ends closed. Paper can be left on the outside of the cans and do not need to be removed

**NO** No butter or cigarette wrappers, chip bags, metal pots or any other metal products.

**NO** No paint or aerosol cans. Save all of these types of cans for the Household Hazardous WasteDay

## Boxes & Paper Bags



Includes fiber-based materials: CORRUGATED CARDBOARD, BOXBOARD, EGG CARTONS, FILE FOLDERS, and TUBES from toilet tissue, etc.

**YES** Flatten and bundle your corrugated cardboard boxes, boxboard, paper bags and brown envelopes together in bundles 30" x 30" x 8" thick or smaller. (75cm x 75 cm x 20 cm). Tie the bundles with twine or string.

**OR** Flatten boxboard and place it in a larger box.

**NO** No waxed or plastic-lined boxes (e.g. most frozen food boxes).

**NO** Do not put any of these materials in plastic bags, or loose in your blue box.

## Glass Bottles & Jars



**NO** **DO NOT PUT GLASS IN BLUE BOX FOR PICK UP. ALL GLASS MUST BE BROUGHT TO THE TRANSFER STATION.**

**YES** Recycle all clear and coloured glass from food or beverages.

**NO** No broken glass containers. Put them in the garbage.

**NO** No other glass items, such as kitchenware, ceramics, drinking glasses, window glass, mirrors, or light bulbs.

## Drink Cartons & Tetra Paks



**YES** MILK & JUICE CARTONS, and TETRA PAK containers for juice, milk, soup, etc. can be recycled.

**YES** Rinse, flatten, and place loose in blue box

## Plastic Containers



Most plastic containers used at home can be recycled, including:

**BOTTLES & JUGS**: pop, water, vinegar, shampoo, dish soap, windshield washer, bleach, etc.

**TUBS & LIDS**: margarine, yogurt, ice cream, cottage cheese, etc.

**BAKED GOODS TRAYS**: clear trays and clamshells marked

**FLOWER POTS & FLATS**: plant pots (up to 12"), cell-paks, carrying flats.

**YES** Rinse and place loose in the blue box

**NO** **STYROFOAM**: foam meat trays, plates, cups, take-out containers and egg cartons (unless cardboard type).

**NO** No plastic trays without a

**NO** No blister paks (e.g. from packages of batteries, screws, small light bulbs).

**NO** No plastic containers from hazardous products

**NO** No plastic toys or other plastic products.

**NO** No Styrofoam packing materials (peanuts, sheets, etc.)

**Reduce, Reuse, Recycle**
